

ANNETTE ESKIND INSTITUTE OF LEARNING

DROP OFF / PICK UP ETIQUETTE

Currey Ingram's school zone is on campus and along Murray Lane between Beech Creek Road and Olde Town Road. By slowing down when you approach and enter our school zone on Murray Lane and following directions from our security officer, you help families trying to enter and exit both the school's main campus and the Child Development Center. On campus, the speed limit is 7 miles per hour.

SCHOOL FORMS

FOUR CONFERENCES

Currey Ingram Academy has a minimum of four parent conferences per year:

1. **Beginning-of-Year Conferences** are a more informative conference and a meeting with student, parent(s), and/or teacher/advisor/mentor.

2. In the **Fall Conference**, the Individualized Learning Plan (ILP) with goals for the year and progress to that point is shared by faculty.

3. In the **Winter Conferences**, ILP goal updates and progress are shared.

4. In the **End-of-Year Conferences**, progress updates for the year are shared, summer recommendations are provided, and if applicable, test results are shared.

The format and purposes for the conferences vary by Division based on the developmental needs of the students. (Parents, students, and/or teachers may request additional conferences at any time during the year.)

LOWER SCHOOL CONFERENCES

For conferences in the Lower School, the students' team of teachers convenes in a one-hour meeting to discuss the goals set for the student as well as the progress being made towards achieving those goals. The team includes the Homeroom, Language Arts, and Math teachers and may also include a Speech-Language Pathologist, Occupational Therapist, the School Counselor, and/or an Administrator. Plans for intervention, remediation and/or enrichment in each academic area are shared and discussed. Any changes made to a child's programming (i.e., change in curriculum), specific work samples, and updated benchmark assessment data are also shared and discussed. For students who begin later in the year, the conference schedule may be modified slightly, with the initial conference occurring about eight weeks after enrollment.

MIDDLE SCHOOL CONFERENCES

The Middle School Beginning-of-Year Conferences are held with your student's Advisor(s). During

Fall and Winter Conferences, parents meet with your child's academic teachers, as well as the Occupational Therapist and/or Speech-Language pathologist, if requested. End-of-Year Conferences may involve select academic teachers and Advisor(s). Administrators may also attend scheduled conferences throughout the school year.Seventhand eighth-grade students are expected to attend conferences in August, October, and February as they have an active role in reporting their progress to their parents and gathering feedback from Faculty. Eighth-grade students will attend a portion of the May conference to discuss Upper School scheduling. Fifth- and sixth-grade students attend August conferences only.

UPPER SCHOOL CONFERENCES

The Upper School has four scheduled conferences each year, with students leading two of these conferences. The first conference is an opportunity for students and parents to meet with the Mentor to review Division procedures and learn more about the Upper School. In the spring conference for students in grades ninth through eleventh, the Mentor reviews the final ILP of the year and standardized testing results, and shares next year's course of study. The two student-led conferences (fall and winter) give the student the opportunity to discuss his/her learning profile, strengths, challenges, progress, and goals with parents and teachers. Parents and teachers also provide each student with positive feedback, corrective feedback, and/or recommendations for improvement. This process provides the student with a clearer understanding of his/her challenges and what accommodations benefit the student's learning. The student-led conference also builds confidence within the student in preparation for college interviews.

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THE CURREY INGRAM ANNUAL FUND

The Annual Fund is the cornerstone of the fundraising programs at Currey Ingram Academy. As an independent school, Currey Ingram receives no government funding and relies on tuition and charitable gifts as the primary sources of funding.

HOW DOES MY GIFT TO THE ANNUAL FUND HELP THE SCHOOL?

Annual philanthropic giving to the Annual Fund allows Currey Ingram to enhance the educational experiences of our students by strengthening and sustaining Currey Ingram's ability to fulfill our mission. SEESAW



GLOSSARY OF TERMS

ACADEMY PAVILION is the home of the Nashville SC Academy and is used by Mustang Athletics for concessions and bathrooms for outside athletic programs. It is located on the west side of campus next to the track, soccer field, and tennis courts.

AEIOL stands for the Annette Eskind Institute of Learning, and it is the school's community outreach program that offers sessions on a variety of topics to help participants better understand child and adolescent development and how children learn. Many sessions are led by Currey Ingram Academy faculty and staff, while some are led by local and national experts.

AGNETA and BROWNLEE CURREY DINING HALL is the official name of the dining hall.

BOOST is the name of the Aftercare program for K-8 students.

CARELL HALL is the Jim and Jan Carell Hall, which houses the Upper School and Henderson Auditorium.

CIPO stands for Currey Ingram Parent Organization.

CDC stands for the Child Development Center, which is open to the public and serves children ages six weeks through Pre-K. The youngest children are located in the modernized Farmhouse at the front of our campus, and ages 3 and 4 and Pre-K classrooms are on the main campus in John Rivers Ingram Hall.

CIA stands for Currey Ingram Academy.

CURREY INGRAM CONNECTS is a program from the Currey Ingram Parent Organization (CIPO) that supports new Currey Ingram families. It serves as a network of families that welcomes people into the community, supports the transition to Currey Ingram, introduces people to traditions at the school, is a place for people to ask questions, and provides opportunities to get involved.

ESKIND HALL houses the Middle School.

FIELD HOUSE is the Jan Carell Field House, which holds Frist Gym, Mustang Gym and a weight room.

FRIST QUAD is the grassy quad in the center of campus surrounded by the academic, administration, and athletic buildings.

FRIST HALL is Jennifer and Billy Frist Hall. In this building at the entrance to campus is the administrative offices, Admission Office, Billing Office, Board Conference Room, Communications Office, Development Office, Diagnostic Center, Dining Hall, Head of School Office, Head's Conference Room, Learning Commons, and Spirit Store.

HENDERSON AUDITORIUM is the Carol Henderson Auditorium, named for the co-founder of Westminster School of Nashville, the predecessor school of Currey Ingram Academy. It is located in the Upper School building, Jim and Jan Carell Hall.

ILP stands for Individualized Learning Plan. The ILP promotes strong communication between the teacher and parents in assessing a student's academic, executive function and social-emotional growth.

JOHN RIVERS INGRAM HALL houses the Lower School.

JEFFREY KUHN FIELD is the name of the track and soccer field.

LEARNING COMMONS is the library and educational database center.

LS stands for the Lower School.

MS stands for the Middle School.

MURRAY THE MUSTANG is the school mascot.

OT stands for occupational therapist.


RESIDENTIAL LIFE Currey Ingram's boarding program for students in grades 9-12.

BANDFEST

Bandfest is celebrated in the fall and in the spring on Frist Quad. Bandfest showcases the musical talents of our Middle School and Upper School students performing in our school rock bands.

COMMUNITY NIGHT

Community Night is held annually in the fall and provides an opportunity for the entire Currey Ingram community to gather on campus. From activity zones to food trucks, a movie on the Quad, Mustang Volleyball games, music, and more, it is a fun-filled evening for the whole family.

CIPO SPRING FUNDRAISER

The Currey Ingram Parent Organization (CIPO) hosts an annual spring fundraiser. It is a casual, fun evening for adults who want a night out to support a great cause – Currey Ingram Academy.

DADS CLUB STEAK DINNER

Dads Club Steak Dinner is a fall event for all Currey Ingram dads. Held in the dining hall, the night is a chance for dads to connect over a free steak dinner. The evening includes a speaker, usually from one of the sports teams.

GRANDPARENTS AND SPECIAL FRIENDS DAY

HENDERSON HOUSE DAY

Spirit days held throughout the year where the school community is encouraged to wear their school issued Henderson House shirt with dress code bottom unless otherwise designated by your student's Division.

HENDERSON MEMORIAL GOLF TOURNAMENT

The Henderson Memorial Golf Tournament began in 2005 to benefit the Britt Henderson Endowed Scholarship Fund at Currey Ingram Academy. It is held annually in the fall, and has raised more than \$1 million for financial aid.

HOMECOMING

Homecoming is an annual winter tradition held in January. Homecoming events include the alumni lunch and basketball game, Mustang Nation Day, and Winter Pep Rally. Homecoming Varsity basketball game, half-time Homecoming Coronation and the Upper School Homecoming Dance.

JOHN RIVERS INGRAM DAY

John Rivers Ingram Day is held every fall on or around October 24, Mr. Ingram's birthday, to celebrate the philanthropic leadership of Stephanie and John Ingram. As part of this celebration, students collect non-perishable food items for Second Harvest Food Bank.
